So....What is the "Core Team"?

- The Core Team is leading a collaborative restoration effort on the Dolores River from McPhee Dam to the Colorado Confluence.
- Main implementers of the DRRP (day-to-day details)
- Reaches out to the DRRP to get work done
- Serve as Chairs of the Committees
- Plans and distribute funding (with DRRP approval)
- Develops, with the BLM and private landowners, Implementation Plans
- Are advisory to the DRRP

Roles of the Respective Core Team Members: *BLM (4 Districts)*

• Are a Key Partner. Involved in monitoring, funding, grazing, "on the ground" work, science, planning and leading

Develop local BLM District-level
 Implementation Plans with TNC and TC

• Links to local partners, other governments and landowners

Roles of the Respective Core Team Members: *The Nature Conservancy*

- Primary role is implementation
- Secondary roles are assisting with planning, monitoring and grazing issues
- Disbursement and management of funding when appropriate
- Coordinates and interfaces with landowners, NRCS, and the BLM

Roles of the Respective Core Team Members: *Tamarisk Coalition*

• Coordinates the monitoring, grazing and funding efforts, and Volunteer Program

• Carries out detail work, planning and works closely with TNC and the BLM in implementation

Interfaces with the BLM and NRCS

Develops partnerships

Roles of the Respective Core Team Members: *Conservation Corps* (3)

• Accomplishes on-the-ground work (is a component of DRRP workforce along with some private contractors); Applies for grants when appropriate to do work

Chairs Outreach/Education Committee

Addresses social goals

Mike Wight represents the CC's on the Core Team

Roles of the Respective Core Team Members: *The Walton Family Foundation*

- Tim Carlson is the representative
- Supports the initiative financially, with other funders
- Interested in the whole watershed
- Builds relationships where needed (at all levels)
- Technical consultation

Roles of the Respective Core Team Members: *Facilitator*

- Marsha Porter-Norton serves in this role
- Tracks on the big picture and helps check in on accountability
- Facilitates DRRP meetings and Committee meetings (as requested) plus Core Team meetings
- Is not involved in details of implementation
- Coordinates clerical and recording support
- Monthly e-newsletter and Web site

- Add BLM reps to Core Team (in process)
- Core Team meets quarterly and participates in monthly phone calls
- Big picture and policy issues are approved by the DRRP
- Team stays "nimble" responding to issues
- Core Team tracks on Action Plan and annual calendar
 - keeps everyone accountable

Key Strategic Directions & Recommendations: *Communication*

- Increase it -- Make it better
- Web site
- Logo
- E-newsletter
- Minutes from Committees go on Web site (DRRP members access minutes)
- Vitalize the Outreach/Education Committee
- Find ways to talk about the DRRP internally and to external audiences

Key Strategic Directions & Recommendations: *Committees*

- Need more involvement!
- More structure: chair, goals, minutes, timelines, etc.
- No Science Committee at this time: Use other means to address science questions/issues

Key Strategic Directions & Recommendations: Funding

- Strategize who applies for which grants
- Multi-year plan
- Pursue multiple funders
- Communicate opportunities to DRRP

Key Strategic Directions & Recommendations: *Monitoring*

- Develop final monitoring protocols (later agenda item)
- Implement program/protocols
- Communicate results
- Understand that science and monitoring are not the same thing
